

Diebold Vault Door: 1 of 4**Kolekcja:** American 19th-20th Century Safes**Muzeum:** Historic Padlocks and Safes**Właściciel:** oshkoshlock**Stan eksponatu:** Nie określono

Opis: Diebold Safe & Lock Company (Canton, Ohio-USA) - Circa 1920. This is all the workings from a vault door - removed from the 3" thick steel slab. It has been re-mounted on heavy boards in the precise original configuration.

There are 32 pictures total, This set shows:

- "1." The door insigne
- "2." Full view with door closed
- "3." Full view with door open
- "4." Various sections going from top to bottom

When complete, this door weighs approx. 3,000 lb. (1361 kg.) and has 16 horizontal (8 left, 8 right) and 6 vertical locking bolts (3 top, 3 bottom). It has two independent three wheel combination locks connected by a vertical bar which allows for dual custody (you can move the locking bolts and open the door by working just one of the combination locks).

Between the two combination locks is a timelock (removed and shown separately). Unless the timelock has wound down to "zero hours" on at least 1 of the 3 clocks (chronometers) the bolts cannot be retracted (door opened).

There are extensive burglar prevention devices on the door - described separately.
